### How do animal skeletons differ? Year 3 Autumn 1 2023



### Science

Intent: To identify the functions of skeletons and how muscles operate in the body.

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. Name a variety of animals that have a skeleton.
- 2. Identify that humans have a skeleton and can name parts.
- 3. Discuss the functions of animal skeletons.
- 4. Name and identify muscles in the human body.
- 5. Discuss functions and how muscles operate in the body.
- 6. Investigate how muscle size affects performance.

Key Vocabulary: backbone, bones, contract, elbow, endoskeleton, exoskeleton, joints, muscles, organs, protect, relax, skeleton, support, tendons, vertebrate

Impact: Children can name parts of the skeleton and muscles in the body. They can also identify functions and how human skeletons differ to animals.

### Geography

Intent: To describe directions on maps using the eight point compass and four figure grid references

### SEQUENCE OF LESSONS

- 1. Know what a compass is and why we use one.
- Use the four compass points to describe directions.
- Identify the eight points on a compass.
- 4. Use the eight compass points to describe directions.
- 5. Use four-figure grid references.
- 6. Describe locations with use of both eight compass points and four figure grid references.

Key Vocabulary: compass, north, east, south, west, grid reference.

Impact: Children can use maps effectively, describing position and direction.

#### Art

Intent: To To communicate ideas through drawing, linking the Cubism approach.

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. Communicate ideas and experiment with techniques through sketching.
- 2. Use nature for inspiration and add tone to a drawing using different techniques.
- Compare the work of different artists within the Cubism movement and identify significant characteristics of this style of artwork.
- 4. Use and combine a range of visual elements to create a piece of artwork.
- Make suggestions for ways to adapt and improve a piece of artwork

Key Vocabulary:colour, line, shape, pattern, Cubist movement

Impact: Children can create a piece of artwork using different techniques to add texture and form and adopt a Cubism approach.

### RE - Diwali (Hinduism)

Intent: To know about the practices and ways of life of a Hindu.

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. To understand what it feels like to have a sense of belonging.
- 2. To know the story of Rama and Sita which represents good versus evil.
- 3. Learn how Hindus celebrate Divali.
- 4. To understand the strong sense of belonging both to the families and the Hindu community.
- 5. To understand why Hindus celebrate Divali and how it is different for a Hindu child.
- 6. To bring together all that has been learnt.

Key Vocabulary: Brahman, life cycle, Vishnu, Shiva, qualities, role, Ganesha, Lakshmi

Impact: To investigate what happens during the festival of Divali and whether the celebrations bring a sense of belonging to Hindus.

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## PSHE (Getting to know each other)

Intent: To understand what makes us special and what makes us work together as a group.

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- Getting to know each other recognizing worth and achievements.
- 2. Learning to face new challenges positively, making responsible choices.
- 3. To understand why rules are needed and how they relate to rights and responsibilities.
- 4. To understand how actions affect myself and others.
- 5. To make responsible choices and take action.
- 6. Understand how actions affect others.

Key Vocabulary: welcome, valued, achievements, proud, pleased, personal goal, praise, acknowledge, affirm.

Impact: To make everyone feel welcomed and valued and to create a class charter to respect and follow.

# Computing - Online Safety and Spreadsheets

Intent: To understand how we stay safe online.

To use spreadsheet tools to represent Data.

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. To understand the importance of keeping passwords safe.
- 2. To understand that what is read on websites is not always true.
- 3. To understand why we use age restrictions on digital media.
- 4. To understand how charts can be made from a table of data.
- 5. To use a range of tools to solve calculations in 2Calculate.
- 6. To understand how to describe cells using their addresses

Key Vocabulary: data, protection, secure, spreadsheet, data, column, cell, bar chart, pie chart, formula, addresses.

Impact: Children understand a number of ways to stay safe online. They know how to represent data on spreadsheets in different ways.

# PE - Tag Rugby and Gymnastics

Intent: to show good control and coordination when carrying out movements.

#### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. To be able to evade and tag opponents
- 2. To be able to evade opponents while keeping control of the rugby ball.
- 3. To be able to pass the ball accurately and receive the ball safely on the move.
- 4. To be able to apply learned skills in a game of tag rugby.

Key Vocabulary: Evade, collision, passing, forward, backwards, try, pass, sideways, backwards, receiver.

#### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. Perform static body shapes.
- 2. Make body shapes in the air.
- 3. Carry out rhythmic gymnastics moves.
- 4. Perform a rhythmic gymnastics routine.
- Create symmetrical shapes.
- 6. Apply the gymnastics skills learnt.

Key Vocabulary: Straddle jump, straight jump half turn, squat on vault, take-off, tucked backward roll, unison, vaulting box, handstand, hurdle step, landing, lunge, pike, rebound, springboard.

Impact: Children will apply learned skills in a game of tag rugby. Impact: Children can perform a gymnastics routine.



### Music

Intent: to learn, improvise and compose an R&B song

### **SEQUENCE OF LESSONS**

- 1. Listen and appraise the song 'Let your Spirit Fly'.
- 2. Musical activities learn to sing the song.
- 3. Musical activities Improvise with the song.
- 4. Musical activities Compose with the song.
- 5. Perform the song.

Key Vocabulary: keyboard, drums, bass, imagination, improvise, compose, disco, pentatonic scale, pulse, rhythm, pitch, tempo, dynamics, texture structure, hook, riff, melody.

Impact: Children can sing and play instruments to accompany a song
